#### Working together to safeguard children 2018

This is a factual update to Working Together to Safeguard Children 2018 to reflect recent changes to legislation, including:

• Integrated Care Boards: from 1 July 2022, integrated care boards have replaced clinical commissioning groups as a result of the Health and Care Act 2022

- Public Health England: has now been replaced by the UK Health Security Agency and the Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (<u>OHID</u>), which is part of the Department of Health and Social Care, and by the UK Health Security Agency. The Chief Public Health Nurse role has transferred to <u>OHID</u>
- Domestic Abuse Act 2021: references to the Domestic Abuse Bill should be read as the
  Domestic Abuse Act 2021
- UK GDPR: references to the GDPR should be read as the UK GDPR. The UK GDPR is the retained EU law version of the GDPR. The UK GDPR sits alongside the Data Protection Act 2018

#### **Statutory framework**

The updated statutory framework sets out the legislation relevant to safeguarding and it should be read alongside the statutory guidance.
